

## Film/Fotocamera – Rollei Bullet HD pro

To make our memories more lively, I decided to film also when in motion. But as my Zebra has a hard suspension, rough roads are felt very quickly. Videos become therefore easily jittered and cannot anymore be used. To correct this, I tried out at least a dozen different ideas to make the filmrecording shock resistant. From a simple suction cup on the windshield to a spring mounted stand with counter balance. Unfortunately, nothing yielded acceptable results.



Finally, a solution seems possible now with the Rollei Bullet HD pro (or similar). Details under (<http://www.rcp-technik.com>). Due to the built in shake protection, the video quality is (at least on normal roads) acceptable now. In addition, it is small, does not avert visibility of the driver and is water proven (for outside use). A long and cumbersome setting up of the camera is also not necessary anymore. The records are stored on a small mini-chip that can be copied to a laptop computer or a DVD. Disadvantage: It only runs on an integrated battery that has to be recharged from time to time (best is to take a few of them with you). Also, when switched on, it takes some seconds until the camera is ready. Standby is possible but consumes also battery capacity. Therefore, it is less suited for snapshots.



What convinced me to buy the camera was the good workmanship (aluminum tube) and the extensive mounting set delivered with the camera. It should allow videorecording/fotoshooting outside the vehicle too (via remote control).

As I own the camera only for a short time, I cannot tell you about its durability on rough roads but so far it seems that it will pass this 'exam'.
